Eastern Connecticut State University is Connecticut's public liberal arts university. Serving 4,355 students in fall 2024, Eastern offers a vibrant, residential campus experience focused on academic excellence, hands-on learning, and community engagement. With 41 majors and 68 minors across the arts, sciences, and professional studies, Eastern prepares students to succeed in a rapidly changing world and workforce.

At the heart of every student's education is the **Eastern Liberal Arts Core (ELAC)**—a distinctive general education program that promotes integrative thinking and lifelong learning. ELAC includes:

- . Liberal Arts Perspectives (LAP) courses that introduce students to multiple disciplines
- Tier 2 Explorations that support interdisciplinary connections
- . A Capstone experience in each student's major that applies learning in a culminating project

Eastern also cultivates a set of Five University Learning Outcomes that define the skills and knowledge all students should develop:

- 1. Communication the ability to express oneself effectively in common college-level written forms and oral presentations.
- 2. Creativity the ability to formulate original ideas and concepts, apply novel solutions, and innovate across disciplinary boundaries.
- 3. Critical Thinking the ability to analyze complex issues, evaluate evidence, and construct reasoned conclusions.
- 4. Ethical Reasoning the ability to assess one's own values, recognize ethical issues, and evaluate the consequences of decisions.
- 5. Quantitative Literacy the ability to reason and solve quantitative problems, evaluate data, and communicate findings.

Founded in 1889, Eastern has grown from a teacher training school into a nationally recognized liberal arts university known for inclusive excellence, small class sizes, and a strong sense of community.
